Dear saints,

Thank you so much to everyone who has already turned in their 2025 pledge card, either in-person or online! Your generosity is going to make a big difference through WPC this year, as we share the Living Water with all who thirst within our church, in Arlington, in Guatemala, and beyond.

In delivering the Toy Drive gifts this year, Rollin Phipps encountered a conundrum. The focus has always been on gifts for foster children, but one woman came to him wanting to donate baby clothes. He hesitated, but decided inwardly that if the PCHAS homes didn't need them, he could always donate them to Mission Arlington. One week before Christmas, he drove down to Itasca to deliver all these items. When the PCHAS staff opened the box of baby clothes, they were delighted! Unbeknownst to us, a one-year-old child was arriving at the home in two days, but PCHAS had nothing ready for them. The box had arrived just in time. As they stood there, one person remarked, "These are gifts for the Christmas child."

This is what it means to be woven together in faith: to offer what we have to God and trust that God will do more with it than we could ever imagine. This month, there are several special events showing that we are woven together with our community: Scout Sunday on February 2; Souper Bowl of Caring on February 9; and Debra's Retirement

Reception on February 16, where we will celebrate her 14 faithful years of service.

So come, find your place in the tapestry of faith at WPC, where we are woven together by the Spirit - with God, with each other, and with our world. May this threefold cord never be broken.

### Financial Report - as of December 31, 2024

As we finish up the year on this cold day, we should be thankful for all we have been given (whether it be in time, talent, or resources) and the opportunities we have been given to help others.

First, know that we have finished the year in excellent financial shape. Your generosity to help run the day-to-day operations of the church is important, but not as important as your generosity to help those around us. For Example Mission Committee has a budget of around \$6,800 (think NEW DAY, Quilters, community outreach). In addition, you made contributions to causes that are dear to you and funneled those funds through WPC. At year-end, I try to highlight some of those causes you support:

Pastor Discretionary Fund \$5,788 New Day \$3,515 One Great Hour of Sharing \$1,381 Christmas Joy \$1,985 Pentecost Offering \$590 Peace/Global Offering \$560 Arlington Charities \$625 Souper Bowl of Caring \$951 Pres. WPC's pledges toward Camp Gilmont's Capital Campaign reached nearly \$44,000 and set the standard for other Presbyterian Churches. The funds will be used to improve their facilities and make camps and retreats available for more kids, youth, and adults to communicate with God through the beauty of nature.

There are many other opportunities that don't require financial support. NEW DAY volunteers who pack and deliver supplies. Quilters who use their talents to warm those in need. Swift Elementary volunteers who give their time to support teachers and students. Talented workers who make our grounds inviting to visitors and keep our building looking good. Volunteers in our media center use their talents to enhance the worship service.

We all play our part and help each other feel our relationship with God grow stronger. Thank you for all you do.


#### **Stewardship 2025**


