In case you've never clearly heard the "Koen prayer," here is what our youngest son prays each evening at the family dinner table. It's short but sweet: "Dear God, Thank you for this day. Thank you for this food. Amen." There's no begging or pleading, there's no confession or lament. Just simply thanksgiving.

For most of us, November gets us thinking about gratitude. Who received the last thank you note you wrote? Who last told you "thank you" and really meant it? When was the last time you thanked God simply for being who God is?

The beloved Presbyterian pastor and theologian Frederick Buechner, in his book *Wishful Thinking*, wrote, "A Christian is one who is on the way, though not necessarily very far along it, and who has at least some dim and half-baked idea of **whom to thank**. A Christian isn't necessarily any nicer than anybody else. **Just better informed**." This definition of Christians includes us: we are on the way, and we have an inkling of who to thank for being on the way: Jesus Christ.

As Presbyterians, we spend our lifetimes growing in grace and gratitude. We thank God, Sunday School teachers, pastors, NEW DAY volunteers, Living Waters for the World leaders, and more. When you give this month - through the grocery basket or the offering plate, through serving on a committee or calling to check on a member - please know that I am thanking God for you. With your gifts great and small, with your prayers and encouragement, your ministry through

# WPC Annual Presbyterian Children's Homes & Services Toy Drive



Did you know the PCHAS Toy Drive started 20 years ago with one church and one bank? Since then hundreds of young people in foster care have been helped.

The Presbyterian Children's Homes and Services (PCHAS) provides assistance to children and their families at two locations in North Texas (Waxahachie and Itasca) which serves children in foster care and single parent families. Along with the PCHAS homes, the annual children's toy drive includes a similar home in Denton.

The collection is not only conducted at our church, but also at over a dozen business locations in the Arlington and Pantego area. Each year, it grows just a little bit more! The children who receive these gifts are sometimes forgotten because of family conflicts or societal oversight.

This year again we will have a Christmas tree for these children. Help us fill it up with age-appropriate toys and Christmas gifts for children ages 1 to 17. Please keep these children in mind as you shop for the holidays. Please place the **unwrapped** gifts under the tree in Bullock Hall between November 15- December 15.

Gift ideas include games, sports equipment, reading materials, necklaces and earrings, and anything that could be theirs alone! The older children appreciate gift cards to fast food restaurants (McDonalds, Starbucks, Chick-fil-a, etc.) or places to shop (Wal-Mart, Target). ### Financial Report - as of September 30, 2024

As we head into our beautiful fall weather, we start to prepare for winter. While we enjoy the cooler weather, we never know what winter will bring us. Our insurance company gives us a checklist of how to minimize damage from frozen pipes and how to prevent a fall on an icy driveway, etc. This is to help us keep down our claims and thus minimize insurance costs. Still, we have budgeted over \$26,000 for 2024 insurance premiums.

While our electric bill will shrink from a high of nearly \$1,600 in July to around \$550 in January, our gas bill will increase from \$80 in July to a high of over \$1,000 in February. All of this to say, it costs just to keep the doors open and the building comfortable. That doesn't even begin to count why we come together: to worship God and serve those He calls us to serve.

We have been fortunate in the past to have saints come before us and pave the way so that we can afford to fulfill our missions. In the past, we have received gifts of property, stocks, remainder trusts and just plain old donations. Several current members have noted that WPC is included in their wills. (Stay tuned for more on this during the coming months).

Whether it be in Nicaragua/Guatemala with Living Waters for the World, NEW DAY, reaching across the street to serve Swift Elementary students and teachers, or all the other missions we have, we know that we make an impact with what we do.

As you begin to plan your year-end income tax strategy, please consider WPC and remember that

together we can make a difference in our corner of the world.

- 3. Pastor Kate updated the session on her progress in her DMin classes.







This has been a trying time for me and my family. I was in school this semester, but because I was going to have Cervical Spine Surgery on August 26, 2024 and would be out of commission for a while, I had to

drop my classes. I found out that a big part of my spinal area did not have any fluid around it due to spinal stenosis. Praise God the surgery was a success! My spine is straight and I have fluid around all parts of my spinal cord. After surgery, I woke up with no feeling in my right arm from my wrist up. The doctors thought it was an MS relapse, but it is C5 palsey. We are praying that this goes away on its own as I am determined to be back in school in the spring of 2025. Ed, Jim and I appreciate all of you so much. Your thoughts and prayers have helped us through this difficult time. Please pray for me as I continue Occupational Therapy and trying to learn how to eat left-handed for a while.
