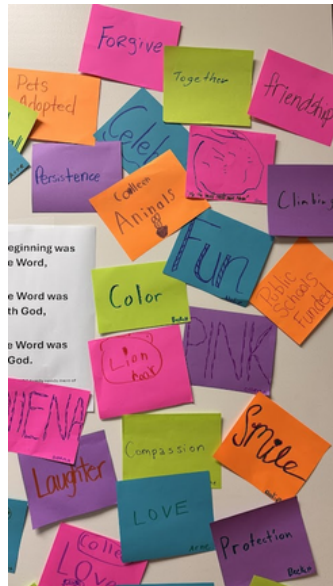
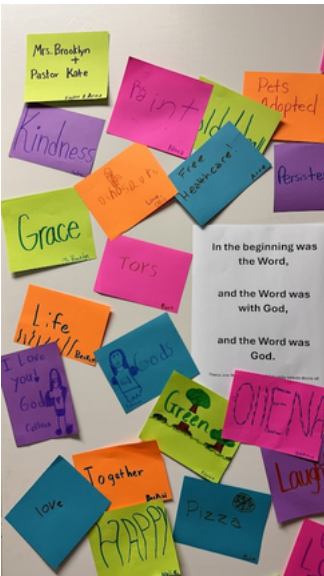
Thank You Jane O

- Oct. 27 - Forgiveness - What Motivates God to Continue Loving Us?



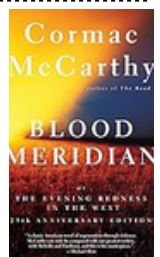
Adult One - Wired Word

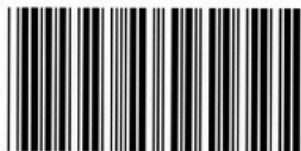

Living Waters for the World Update

As reported in the last WPC Well newsletter, our plans were to find a partner for an installation in Guatemala. Grace Presbyterian, Temple and WPC have entered into a covenant agreement with Instituto Escuela Rural Mixta Canoas Altas, a Middle school in the Lake Atitlan area southwest of Guatemala City. The middle school is on a campus that includes an elementary school. The water purification system will be in a building on the middle school portion of the campus. It will serve both the elementary and middle schools.

The management team and water committee, for the water system includes the school principal, and board members. All of who have signed the covenant.

Upon approval and signing the covenant we will begin the process of purchasing the system, making arrangements for delivery to Guatemala, working with the in-county LWW staff, determining the date for installation and outlining the responsibilities for everyone. The school is responsible for having a secure building for the system, a dependable water supply and electricity source. It is also their responsibility to provide a staff to operate the system, and have a water committee to support and promote the use of water in their community.

At this time the potential date for an installation is early 2025. Catherine Fritz and Matt Baltensperger will represent WPC on the project. Each of them has concluded training at LWW's Clean Water University (CWU). Catherine will focus on teaching the community the benefits of clean water and how to properly use it. Matt's focus will be on system installation and training the Water Team on day-to-day operations.

Your WPC LWW team appreciates the continued support of everyone. We feel it is a very meaningful mission for those we provide safe/healthy water for an area where all they have is unclean water and subsequent lingering health issues.

Elder Nominating Season coming!

Have you ever wondered how elders are nominated year after year? In a nutshell, it's WPC members who make this possible. Each year, 3-5 Session elders (leadership team) rotate off their terms of 2-4 years. The Nominating Committee meets and votes on new candidates submitted by both Committee members and the rest of the congregation. Candidates are contacted to invite their commitment to be an Elder for a minimum 2-year term. Their names and bios are brought to the congregation the first part of December for approval, and then they are ordained and/or installed at the beginning of the new year. This year, the group of elders has completed a review and update of their responsibilities for the church's Manual of Operations, so there is a very detailed 'road map' for the new elder stepping into their role.

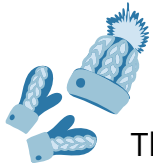
What are the qualifications to serve as an elder you might ask?

- Be a member in good standing at WPC for 1-2 years.
- Support the church spiritually and financially, and participate in church worship and activities as much as possible.
- Be a good communicator...an elder usually leads a committee of people. The elder doesn't do all the work, but needs to be able to supervise/lead periodic meetings. Encourage and recruit new membership on their committees.
- Write brief report for Session members to review prior to attendance at monthly meetings (4th Sunday of each month).
- Monitor and submit annual budget for the area they are responsible.

Peace & Global Witness Offering October 6



On World Communion Sunday, we celebrate that Christ's peace extends throughout all creation. Whenever the church gathers for worship, we are assured of Christ's peace. We celebrate that we are connected, we are loved and we are not alone. We worship together and are fed from Scripture and at Christ's table of peace. Extending the peace of Christ is part of an active, engaged faith—a witness to what it means for us to be the Church, together. Through participation in the Peace & Global Witness Offering, our church is extending Christ's peace throughout our community and our world. We begin at the communion table, with our siblings in every time and place, and we celebrate the peace we find there and commit to building a more just and peaceful world.

Peace is possible, and it begins with us sowing the seeds of peace in every interaction and decision we make. The Peace & Global Witness Offering encourages the church to cast off anxiety, fear, discord and division. So we can embrace God's mission of reconciliation to those around us and around the world. A gift to the Peace & Global Witness Offering enables the church to promote the Peace of Christ by addressing systems of conflict and injustice across the world. WPC retains 25% of this Offering for our own peacemaking efforts, going to Mission Arlington this year. Mid-councils retain an additional 25% for ministries of peace and reconciliation. The remaining 50% is used by the Presbyterian Mission Agency to advocate for peace and justice in cultures of violence, including our own, through collaborative projects of education and Christian witness.



Financial Report - as of August 31, 2024

As we are now two-thirds of the way through the year, we can look back and see how WPC has weathered the cold of the winter/spring and the heat of our Texas summer. Did you realize that in the summer, our electric bill reached over \$1,700 for August? And to keep our lawn looking nice, we spent nearly \$475 in August for water (of course, over half is for sewer fees) and the annual insurance costs for 2024 is over \$26,000.

That doesn't include repairing aging air conditioner units or replacing the 27 year old water heater in Fellowship Hall. As you can see, it takes the support of everyone just to open the doors and keep everyone comfortable.

That doesn't take away from what we actually come together for, and that is to worship God and fulfill the mission that He has put in front of us: to help our neighbors at Swift Elementary, to feed the hungry through NEW DAY, to help furnish clean water through our Living Waters for the World, or furnish beautiful quilts to those in need. That is naming just a couple of examples of what we can do together.

With your support, either through prayer, physical labors and/or financial support, we can continue to grow in service together.

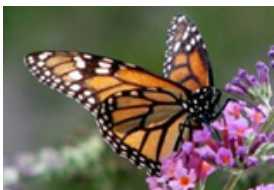

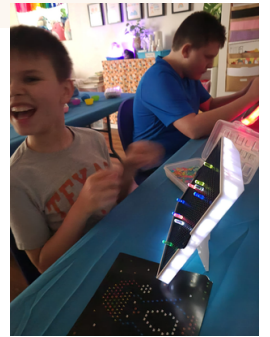

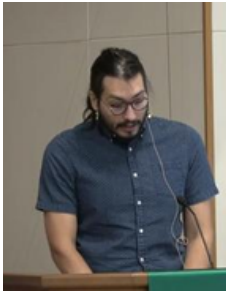
