


Jonathan Livingston Seagull

Allegory about a seagull who is trying to learn about flying, which involves personal reflection, freedom, and self-realization.




Blood Meridian


A Psalm for the Wild-Built

Solarpunk novella in which a monk and a robot explore the wilderness and ask questions about the divine and the purpose of life.




The Curious Incident of the Dog in the Night Time

Mystery novel from the perspective of a 15-year-old neurodivergent boy. It brims with imagination, empathy, and vision.




Title:




Pilgrim's Progress

Author: John Bunyan

Date: 1678

Allegorical story of the good man's pilgrimage through life. Started while Bunyan was in jail for holding non-Church of England worship services. It is regarded as one of the most significant works of theological fiction in English literature.



The Chosen

Author: Chaim Potok

Date: 1967

Novel set in Brooklyn in the 1940s. It's a coming of age story for Jewish teenagers, with themes highlighting the importance of father-on bonds, pursuit of truth, strength of friendship, importance of silence, and the struggle of tradition vs modernity.
